CCMAC has ten Community Representative positions available for a two year term from February 2023 to February 2025. Representatives will be chosen by election at the CCMAC annual meeting at Omnibus Theatre on Thursday 2 February 2023.

Nominees should be resident in one of six local authority wards that border the Common: Clapham Town, Clapham Common & Abbeville, Clapham East, Balham, Northcote, and Shaftesbury & Queenstown or represent a major user group (e.g. sports or community) on Clapham Common.

Candidates must have the time available to make a meaningful contribution to the Committee's work. This includes monthly meetings of the whole Committee lasting no more than 2 hours; meetings every 1-2 months of working groups (each Committee member typically sits on one or two working groups); and email correspondence between meetings.

Members may also volunteer for activities on the Common, such as assisting with Bandstand concerts, litter picking or community gardening.
